School Board Awards Construction Contracts for Four GOB Projects Valued at \$22.5 Million!

The Miami-Dade School Board awarded four construction contracts to complete General Obligation Bond (GOB) projects valued at approximately \$22.5 million. The projects will be undertaken at four elementary schools. Our very own, Miami Shores Elementary, was chosen as one of the four construction contracts that was awarded. Thornton Construction Company, Inc. was awarded the construction contract for the bond-funded renovations and classroom addition project at Miami Shores Elementary. Built in 1929 on a 4.8-acre parcel of land, the school currently has seven permanent buildings with 714 student stations. After completion of the project, the school will have a new five-classroom building addition with 116 additional student stations. The scope of work includes a new PE shelter, roof replacement of the media center, a new Energy Management System, replacement of the drinking fountains and restroom renovations, new parking spaces and select interior paint.
