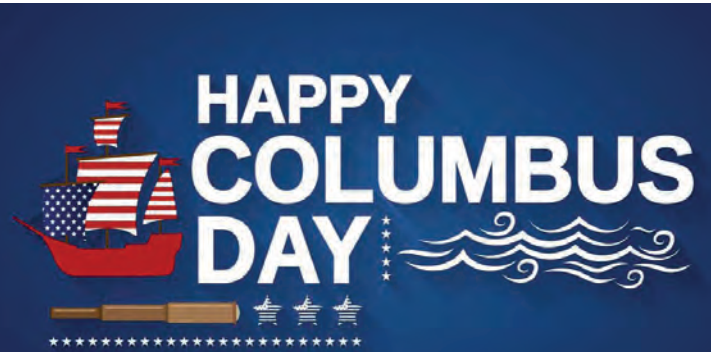

COUNCIL INFORMATION

The October 2021 meetings will be held at 6:30 PM on Tuesday, October 5 and Tuesday, October 19 in the 9900 NE 2nd Avenue Building, Miami Shores, FL 33138.

SEPTEMBER COUNCIL ACTIONS

- Approved resolutions, adopting the operating and debt service ad valorem millage levies as well as the operating and capital budgets for Fiscal Year 2021-2022.
- Declared September as Childhood Cancer Awareness Month.
- Adopted an Ordinance on Second Reading, amending Chapter 15 of the Code of Ordinances to Add Article III, the "Miami Shores Village Human Rights Ordinance" to the September 23, 2021 Village Council Meeting.
- Approved a resolution, extending a temporary moratorium on enforcement of Section 541 of the Miami Shores Village Code of Ordinances due to Covid-19. The Village Council further directed the Village Manager and Village Attorney to review and propose changes to Section 541 that are aligned with the post COVID-19 environment and for such findings to be brought forth for Council consideration.
- Approved a resolution, authorizing the Village Manager to execute an agreement between the Village and The State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management, regarding payment and acceptance of American Rescue Plan Act Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund.
- Directed the Village Manager to work with staff to coordinate a Village Bike Ride for Statewide Mobility Week (10-29 through 11-5-2021).
- Appointed Mr. Esmond K. Scott as Village Manager.
- Approved Legislative Priorities for the 2022 Florida Legislative Session.
- Appointed Councilmember Crystal Wagar as the non-voting ex-officio member of the Village Council to serve on the Sustainability and Resiliency Committee. Councilmember Alice Burch was appointed as the alternate member.
