IT'S TIME TO CELEBRATE!

Did you know that Miami Shores Village is celebrating its 90th Anniversary this year?

In 1925, Developer Hugh Anderson planned a community of homes in an area just north of Miami on beautiful Biscayne Bay with acres of farms, pineapple fields, and avocado and mango groves serving as home to pioneers since the mid 1800's. Mr. Anderson envisioned landscaped streets with magnificent homes deserving of the title "America's Mediterranean."

However, this dream bubble burst with the real estate boom, but Miami Shores was still "clinging on to life" when Bessemer Properties took control of the development and by 1932, the Village was growing again. "The Village Beautiful" was incorporated on January 2, 1932.

Today, with a population exceeding 10,000, local residents remain dedicated to preserving the quality of life that the Village's founders envisioned. Our celebratory theme for this 90th anniversary year, "Fostering Community," evokes the idea that a sustainable, thriving Miami Shores is one that is healthy, safe and unified.

Look for events each month throughout the year that celebrate 90 years. We hope you will join us for our year-long celebration.

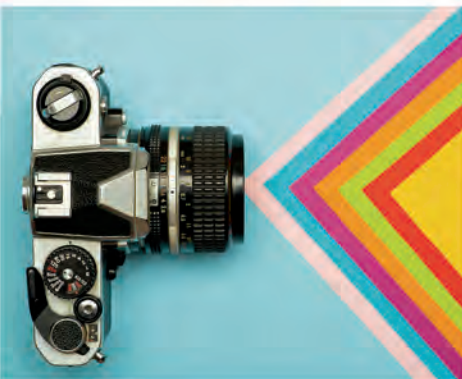

Celebrate Black History Month all month long at the Library

Beginning February 1st, visitors can take a self-guided tour of *The Black History of Miami Shores Exhibition*. Commissioned for the Black History Month celebration in 2020 as a series of displays and excerpts from historical documents that take the viewer through decades of local history placed within the broader context of American history.

In this year's exhibit, South Florida People of Color (SFLPoC) is updating the progress we have made towards an inclusive and equitable community while acknowledging the 90th Anniversary Celebration of Miami Shores Village, which was incorporated on January 2, 1932.

The exhibit is an effort to open up dialogues among members of communities about our shared history. The updated exhibit will take us right up to the present and will be on display during the entire month of February at the Brockway Memorial Library. Free.

Police Chief, David Golt

Village Manager, Esmond Scott has appointed David Golt as Police Chief of the Miami Shores Police Department. After an extensive selection process based on positive and challenging elements, the decision came down to three candidates.

Chief Golt was appointed Interim Chief of the MSPD in October 2021, when long-standing Chief Lystad retired. Chief Golt started his career with Miami Shores in 2015 as a Lieutenant in charge of investigations, policy management and special projects. His experience as Chief of Police for the Broward County District Schools and as Deputy Police Chief for the Pembroke Pines Police Department solidified his law enforcement professionalism. Over the past three months, Village Manager Scott had the opportunity to work collaboratively with Chief Golt on both day-to-day operational matters and short and long term initiatives. Golt's leadership style, his decision-making process and his community engagement made him a top candidate. Chief Golt is calm under pressure and feels passionately about the department and its commitment to excellence. We look forward to his operational integrity and his strengthening of community trust.

VILLAGE COUNCIL INFORMATION

REGULAR COUNCIL MEETINGS

The February 2022 meetings will be held at 6:30 PM on February 1st and 15th at The MSV Multiuse Facility located at 9900 NE 2nd Avenue. You may view the meeting via livestream on meeting night or after the meeting from the Village website at www.msvfl.gov or on the Miami Shores Village YouTube channel.

RECENT COUNCIL ACTION

- Approved an ordinance, amending Article V, Division 17, "Landscape", adding Section 539, "Fertilizer Standards."
- Deferred the FLUM and rezoning items to the February 15, 2022 Village Council Meeting and directed the Village Attorney to draft an ordinance imposing a temporary moratorium on Future Land Use and Rezoning Applications (exempting single-family) and for such item to be brought forth for Village Council consideration at the February 15 Village Council Meeting.
- Approved an ordinance on second reading, adopting the 2022 Capital Improvements Project Schedule Annual Update to the Miami Shores Village 2025 Comprehensive Plan.
- Approved an ordinance on first reading, amending Article V, Division V, "Off-Street Parking Requirements", adding Section 521(2)(c), "Replacement of Non-Conforming Driveways."
- Appointed Larry Aguilar to the Personnel Appeals Board.
- Approved a resolution, authorizing Miami Shores Village to join the State Of Florida and other local governmental units as a participant in the Florida Memorandum of Understanding and Formal Agreements implementing a unified plan for the settlement of the opioid litigation.
- Directed the Village Manager, Village Attorney, and Village Clerk to bring forth evaluation templates used by municipalities to evaluate the performance of said positions by the February 15, 2022 Village Council Meeting.
