



Miami Shores Village takes great pride in being one of the most beautifully landscaped communities in Miami-Dade County. This is in thanks to the great importance our residents and team members place on making it look great and environmentally conscious. In addition to the hard work, the Village has active arborists on staff. They assist in appropriate tree pruning and trimming in the public right of ways. As a Village homeowner, you are responsible for the upkeep of any swale or parkway areas. Please see below for the Village ordinance(s) that outlines these responsibilities:

Sec. 20-17. - Responsibilities of property owners regarding parkway area abutting street.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any owner of property in the Village to allow the parkway portion of an abutting street to be or remain in such condition as to make the use thereof unsafe or dangerous.
- (b) Said property owners shall be responsible for the maintenance of the parkway abutting his property. This shall include mowing of grass, trimming of shrubs, and removal of trash and litter but shall not include trimming of trees. Parkway is defined as that portion of the street not paved and maintained by Miami Shores Village.

Along with all the beneficial attributes associated with having beautiful trees in the community, there are many times when trees located on the public right of way need to be trimmed. The trees might be obstructing a walkway, a street sign, or encroaching onto private property. In these scenarios, it is vital to inform the Village of these various issues in order to take action. You can report it to the Miami Shores Village Public Works Department at 305-795-2210. The Village will follow up with an inspection to assess the tree and respond accordingly.

Let the Village work for you in these scenarios. It is a violation of the Village's ordinance to trim, cut, or prune any tree in the public right of way. The violation carries fines and can result in special assessments being levied against the property.

Sec. 15-8. - Damaging, defacing Village property.

(a) It shall be unlawful to cut, tear, burn, pluck or otherwise damage or remove any tree, shrub, flower or other plant on a public park or parkway, or on village property, without authority of the Village.
