RFP No. 2022-09-01 Towing Services October 17, 2022

This Addendum to the above-referenced RFP is issued in response to questions from prospective contractors or other clarifications and revisions issued by the Village. The RFP is amended in the following particulars only. Deletions are shown by strikethrough and additions are <u>underlined</u>.

1. <u>Question</u>: What is the number of private vehicles towed on an annual basis?

<u>*Response</u>: Previously Miami Shores Village Police Department did not track the history of the number of private vehicles towed.</u>*

2. <u>Question</u>: What is the number of Village Owned vehicles towed on an annual basis?

<u>*Response*</u>: There were approximately six (6) heavy trucks and two (2) vehicles towed for the Public Works Department. The Police Department has no record of the number of police vehicles towed.

3. <u>Question:</u> Section 3.16.1 Radio Communications requires all towing vehicles be equipped with a two-way radio. In lieu of a two-way radio system, may the towing contractor utilize a computer application for dispatching from the dispatch desk directly to an application on the tow truck operators smart phone?

<u>Revision to RFP:</u> Section 3.16 COMMUNICATION is <u>amended</u> as follows:

- 3.16.1 <u>Radio Communications:</u>
 - 3.16.1.1 All towing vehicles must be equipped with a two-way radio or <u>enabled</u> <u>transportation dispatch software</u> that provides continuous direct contact between the Contractor's base station and all service trucks utilized in providing towing service. A citizens' band radio does not meet this requirement.
 - 3.16.1.2 There must be twenty-four (24) hour radio communication or <u>enabled</u> <u>transportation dispatch software</u> which is manned seven (7) days per week, 365 days per year by competent employees. Phone answering services are not permitted.

- 4. <u>Revision to RFP:</u> The approved rates for Miami-Dade County were revised as of October 16, 2022. Attachment "B" has been <u>amended</u> to reflect the rate changes and is attached.
- 5. <u>Question:</u> In what manner should reports be submitted. Is there an established format which Miami Shores prefers them to be constructed? Can these reports be submitted electronically? Or does the Village prefer hard copies to be provided?

<u>*Response:*</u> See Section 3.31 REPORTS. "The form of the reports shall be determined by the Contractor but are subject to the approval of the Village". <u>The Village will accept the reports either electronically or by hard copy.</u> The Contractor shall submit a sample report with proposal.
